#### **Provincial concerns**

Last month we shared with you a couple of ideas on how to be smart with your water usage. This month we will be talking about Fire smarting your homes.

Your actions today can minimize wildfire damage to your home and property tomorrow.

Flames aren't the only threat. An estimated 90% of homes damaged or destroyed by wildfire are ignited by embers. By taking proactive **FireSmart** measures around your house and yard, you can increase your properties' resistance to wildfire.

Here are a few FireSmart tips:

- Review your evacuation plan for your family and pets.
- Have your 72hrs emergency kit ready.
- Remove leaves, pine needles and other debris from your roof and gutters.
- Mow grass and weeds to 10 cm in length or less.
- Remove everything combustible within 10 m of your home, such as toys, patio furniture, cushions, decorative items, firewood, and potted plants that are on and under your deck. Move all combustible items into your shed, home, or garage.

If you want to prepare for the season but you need help **FireSmarting** your lot, Deacons poop scoop and lawn care services will be back this summer. He can also shovel your sidewalk right now.

#### This months concern

We have received a couple of complaints concerning roaming cats in town. To help with the ever growing population, we are updating the Animal Bylaw and will be specifying the option available for dealing with those strays.

Why is this a popular issue? Stray cats are roaming the streets and they are not fixed. If you own a cat and you let him or her out, we ask that you be a responsible pet owner and have them spayed or neutered.

Roaming cats are a community nuisance; they dig in gardens or defecate on neighbour's property. Outdoor cats kill thousands of songbirds each year. This greatly impacts our Village biodiversity and natural health.

### Canadian Dental Care Plan

THE ALLIANCE UPDATE

Letters inviting seniors to apply for the Canadian Dental Care Plan are being sent out in phases, with all eligible seniors 70 years of age or older expected to be invited to apply by end of March 2024.

You may apply by phone or in person at a Service Canada Centre or at a clinic in the community. Once you make the application, you will be informed if you qualify for the CDCP (system-generated message or Service Canada Rep will inform you).

If you have dental coverage through a provincial or federal government social program, you can still qualify for the CDCP. If you meet all the eligibility criteria, your coverage will be coordinated between the 2 plans to ensure there are no duplication or gaps in coverage.

If you qualify for CDCP, you will receive a welcome package from Sun Life (in approximately 3 months). The welcome package will include a member card, a list of dental services covered and the start date of coverage.

Appointments with a dental care provider should be scheduled on or after the start date of coverage. The CDCP will not reimburse for services received before the start date of coverage. The earliest coverage could begin is May 2024 (but is unique to each person). Service Canada is offering information sessions and application intake clinics to increase awareness of the program and help seniors apply.

**\*\*Scam Notice:** Please be aware that scam attempts have been reported, such as welcome packages that ask for SIN, date of birth, banking information or email or text message asking person to click on a link or provide personal information.
