Effective Thursday April 11 at 1:00pm The Village of Alliance has implemented a Fire Restriction.

This Fire Restriction includes:

- All existing FIRE PERMITS are <u>SUSPENDED</u> and prohibits the issuance of any new permits. All existing open burns musts be extinguished.
- Prohibits the discharge of FIREWORKS.

The following are PERMITTED during this Fire Restriction:

- Burning barrels equipped with a metal mesh
- Safe wood campfires in approved fire pits on private lands and in campgrounds.
- Portable propane fire pits.
- Gas or Propane stoves and BBQ, including briquettes.
- Catalytic or infrared style heaters
- Pellet style electric smokers.

Off-Highway Vehicles can start wildfires - check frequently to ensure hotspots are free of debris, and make sure mufflers and spark arrestors are working properly.

Never leave a campfire unattended. Soak it, stir it and soak again until cool to the touch to ensure it is extinguished.

This Fire Restriction will remain in effect until further notice and can change at any time.

Alberta's Current Drought Conditions

Alberta is currently in water shortage management stage 4 (out of 5), where multiple water management areas are impacted by water shortage. Alberta's government is monitoring conditions and working closely with water users and local governments to help manage and conserve water where possible.

Effective Strategies for Saving Water

- Effective Strategies for Saving Water
- Take Care of Every Drop!
- Take shorter (5 minutes) showers.
- Do not let the water run needlessly
 Fill the sink instead of letting the water run when washing dishes.
- Fix leaks, including leaky toilets and faucets
- Use dishwashers and washing

Outdoor water conservation tips in spring and summer

- Plant drought tolerant vegetation.
- Water your lawn no more than necessary.
- Water sparingly in the morning or evening to reduce evaporation.
- Collect and reuse water for outdoor plant.
- Clean outside with a broom instead of a hose.
- Check for leaks in outdoor pipes, faucets, and hoses.

THE ALLIANCE UPDATE

VILLAGE OF ALLIANCE BYLAW #2024-04 KEEPING AND CONTROLLING OF ANIMALS

Section 5.A.ii.:

"NUISANCE ANIMALS: No animal shall be allowed to be a nuisance. A nuisance shall include, but not be limited to: Biting, scratching or chasing a person or animal; Barking, howling, meowing, chirping or otherwise disturbing any person; Causing damage to property or other animals; Defecating on property on other than that of the owner."

Owners who fail to comply with the Alliance **KEEPING AND CONTROLLING OF ANIMALS** Bylaw could be subject to a fine. In the event that complaints have been made about Excessively bark/howl/otherwise disturbing the neighborhood, a first written warning will be sent to the owner. If no changes are made and complaints are resubmitted, The Village of Alliance has the right to charge the owner of the animal a fine. **Excessively bark/howl/otherwise disturbing the neighborhood:** For a first Offence \$150.00 - Subsequent Offence \$300.00 Why is my dog barking?

- Barking to get something good to happen: Dogs can learn that barking is great way of quickly getting our attention. Even us telling them to be quiet may be rewarding, because they enjoy being looked at and spoken to.
- Barking at night or when left alone: Dogs that are distressed about being left alone may howl or bark to try to get back to their owners.
- Barking to prevent something bad from happening: When your dog is frightened about something and feels under threat, whether the threat is real or not, they might bark at whatever is scaring them to make it go away. If barking works to get rid of the scary thing, your dog will learn to bark again next time they want to feel safe.
