Wonton Soup

Ingredients:

- 50 - 60 wonton wrappers

Wonton Filling

- 200 g / 7 oz lean pork mince (ground pork)
- 200 g / 7 oz peeled prawns / shrimp, chopped
- 1 tbsp ginger, finely grated
- 2 shallots / green onions, finely chopped
- 1 tbsp light soy sauce
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 2 tbsp sesame oil, toasted

Broth (for 2 servings)

- 3 cups / 750 ml chicken broth
- 2 garlic cloves, smashed
- Small piece of sliced ginger (optional, but highly recommended)
- 1½ tbsp light soy sauce
- 2 tsp sugar
- ¼ - ½ tsp sesame oil

Directions:

1. Place Filling ingredients in a bowl. Use a potato masher to mash until fairly smooth
2. Lay Wontons on work surface. Use teaspoon to put the Filling on the wontons. Work in batches of 5 if starting out, up to 15 or 20 if confident. Brush 2 edges with water. Fold to seal, pressing out air. Brush water on one corner and bring corners together, pressing to seal.
3. Place wrapped wontons into a container with a lid as you work (so they don't dry out).
4. **To cook:** bring a large pot of salted water to boil. Place wontons in water and cook for 4-5 minutes. Remove with slotted spoon straight into serving bowls. Ladle over broth.
5. **Broth:** Place Broth ingredients in a saucepan over high heat.
6. Place lid on, bring to simmer then reduce to medium high and simmer for 5 - 10 minutes to allow the flavors to infuse. Pick garlic and ginger out before using.
7. **To freeze Wonton:** Freeze uncooked in airtight containers. Cook from frozen for 6 to 8 minutes. **IMPORTANT:** Do not freeze if you made this with defrosted frozen prawns.
